## GREATEST IS THE ONE WHO SERVES

We are to honour one another above ourselves. Serving one another is a very practical and concrete way to honour one another. Serving could mean doing helpful deeds for one another, helping others who need assistance, spending time with others, or offering a service to others.

Serving others requires us to have a servant attitude, to want to serve others and have an observant eve to see what needs to be done. Serving others means showing genuine care for people, even the people society does not usually think about or considers unlovable. If we have a servant attitude and a real love for others, we can develop an observant eye. The reason most of us do not see the opportunities to serve is that we are constantly thinking about ourselves instead of others. Service requires us to look at the interest of others and not our own interests.

Service to others does not have to mean going away to a developing country, doing a Values-In-Action programme or Community Involvement Programme. We can all do something that makes a difference in the lives of others in our own country, our neighbourhood, at our home, or even during the BB parade time. The BB Share-A-Gift (BBSG) and BB CARES, are



two such local community service projects of the BB, which are platforms used to nurture our Boys to care for the less privileged in our society and to mould the Boys' character.

We can all use our gifts, time, money, talents or energy to serve and help improve the lives of others, including that of our own family members. We can help others economically, socially, physically, and spiritually. For example, we can share our food with those in need; we can be a friend to a newcomer: we can care for someone who is sick; we can comfort someone who grieves; we can help an elderly person cross the road; or we can spend time with the less fortunate. In our homes, we can serve by helping with household chores such as washing up the dishes after meals and mopping the floor; we can help our siblings

to read and write; or we can encourage our loved ones who may be going through difficult times.

Service and humility go hand in hand. We are reminded to "do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others." (Book of Philippians).

Greatness is determined by how many we serve and not by how many have served us. Our natural self desires the idea of others serving us and serving others is contrary to our own nature. However, we are to serve one another, to love one another, and to consider others better than ourselves. Real greatness is not in position or authority but in serving one another.

### **West 2 Cluster-Level BB CARES**

Eight BB Companies in the West 2 Cluster gathered together on 14 July to support the Habitat for Humanity (HFH) Singapore in their 'Home Sweep Home' programme at three locations around the island. The Companies are:

The Boys and Primers were roped in for the planning phase from March to July 2018. They were involved in several pre-event preparations, namely, packing of goodie bags and carnival set-up. On event day, they were assigned roles such as Carnival Helpers, Runners, Logistics Team, Ushers and Unlitter Red Dot (URD) Team Leaders, who would lead a team of 20 adult volunteers to pick litter.





"Overall, the experience was memorable and enriching as it was nice to see how various groups of people reacted and responded when they realised the urgency of the issue. It also honed some of our life skills such as communications, planning and teamwork while serving the community."

SGT Asher Pang Ang Sheng (39th Coy, URD Team Leader at Bedok) "Doing the running was tough. In the morning, we were briefed about the conditions of the houses we were to clean up and repaint. One of the houses that was assigned to me was infested with bed bugs, which was a first for me. I was not assigned to clean up the house as I was under 15 years of age. Instead, I helped the others to move the things around within the house. It was a good experience for me."

### **Company-Level BB CARES**

Having previously served the elderly in old folks' homes, raised awareness for endangered animals and conservation of water, the 4th Singapore Company in Whitley Secondary School decided to do yet another new area of community service for BB CARES. They decided to partner with Mummy Yummy, an NGO that was started in 2013 to provide free vegetarian food to needy elderly. Today, Mummy Yummy distributes free food monthly to at least 159 rental blocks across Singapore.

On 20 July, the Company set off with enthusiasm to bless the residents of six blocks of flats in Toa Payoh, having conducted a recce in the area previously in June. A total of 35 Boys, two Officers and two teachers were mobilised – all with a single mind and heart to serve. They carried out door-to-door visits and provided the vegetarian packaged food prepared by the Mummy Yummy staff for residents.


