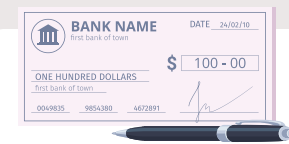

The Boys' Brigade Headquarters (BBHQ) in Singapore has relocated three times from our first HQ at the Prinsep Street Presbyterian Church to the YWCA Building, then the Bible House and finally to the present BBHQ at 105 Ganges Avenue on 1 July 1985. This year is our 36th year at the current BBHQ site. In the second half of 2021, we will be relocating for the fourth time, to 10 Kwong Avenue. With every move, a new season begins.

Stepping into a new season presents us with new opportunities and possibilities, and with every new opportunity and possibility comes changes and challenges. There will be some that we like and some we do not, but we need to embrace the change and see challenges as a means for us to innovate and advance. We need to explore how we can achieve the vision of the new BBHQ while holding on to our mission to nurture youth/children, based on Christian values, to lead and serve, and fulfil the Object of the Boys' Brigade (BB) through our Beliefs and the BB Methods. In the new season, our vision for the new BBHQ is to be a resource to grow new BB Companies for children and youth from pre-school to tertiary and to serve and bless the community. We will seek to:



**1.** Grow new BB Companies to Nurture Young Lives – Our vision is to build up the young to be pillars of Singapore by mentoring and developing in them godly character so that they become responsible citizens and leaders in society. This will be done by having Open Units with badgework interest groups like leadership, outdoor adventure, sports, performing arts, and community service.



**2.** Serve the Community through Intergenerational Community Life – Our vision is to provide platforms for BB Boys to interact and engage with people of all ages and across generations through interest groups such as urban farming, recycling and green projects, as well as community service events such as BB CARES and BB Share-a-Gift Projects.



We need to look and move forward and embrace the new season. When we carry our past for too long, we cannot focus on our future because we are too busy worrying about our past or being too comfortable with our past. We need to pay attention and keep our mind on the new vision lest the former tries to take over.

We shall continue to work together in unity and oneness of purpose, while appreciating and leveraging the diversity of individuals and organisations, to succeed in the new season. # So That You May Be Mature and Complete

I have been a BB Boy, Officer, Captain, and Chaplain, in several BB Companies, before I came into my current role as Associate Brigade Chaplain. My BB experiences have shaped me in so many ways. One of the earliest and most indelible memories was overcoming my fear of heights.



I was 14 and attending a leadership training camp and we had to attempt an obstacle course. The course comprised various hand-built high elements constructed from wooden spars and plenty of rope. These included, amongst other things, a flying fox station, a Jacob's ladder, and what turned out to be my nemesis — the Burmese bridge.

This swinging and unwieldy bridge comprised a single thick rope for your feet and two thinner guide ropes for your arms. The idea was to walk along the single rope and use your arms to push outwards on the guide ropes to create tension and stability, as you crossed a deep chasm. I found myself breaking out in cold sweat and failing miserably at this station.

One of my Officers noticed this. When everyone else went on to do drill on the parade square, he made me return to the Burmese bridge. For a torturous lifetime of an hour, I attempted the obstacle over and over again, until I was able to cross it and without fear.

The letter of James says:

Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance. Let perseverance finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything. (James 1:2-4, NIV)

Overcoming my fear of heights was a trial of sorts. Persevering through the trial or test of repeatedly facing the fear and overcoming it helped me become more complete by overcoming my fear. As a world, as a nation, and as Boys, Primers, and Officers of The Boys' Brigade, we are facing the trial and testing of the disruption and changes the current pandemic has forced upon us in our personal lives, in school, at work, and yes, in the way we function as BB Companies.

Each of you—Boys, Primers and Officers—have had to cope with the strain of change. Despite all this, many of you are finding new and creative solutions for us to continue being active as a BB community in your Companies. This perseverance on your part is a good and joyful thing because this testing of your faith in God, in each other, and in the purposes of the BB, and your creative response will shape you. So, press on, and in the words of James, "Let perseverance finish its work so that you may be mature and complete." Amen.

# Kicking Fit

Wanting the graduating batch of Boys to experience something different, the 19th Singapore Company in Yishun Town Secondary School organised kickboxing sessions for them!

The Boys were taught by the Company's alumnus Mr Leonard Wong. Now a fitness instructor, Mr Wong coached the 15 Secondary Four Boys on 27 March and 10 April with safe management measures in place.



"Overall, I found the two-hour kickboxing session enjoyable and meaningful. I got to learn some basic self-defence skills which was something I have been interested in, but never got the chance to try. For me, the pace of the training was easy to follow and the coach was very patient and clear with his instructions. Even though it was tiring and many of us made similar mistakes, it was still fun. The session was interactive and we poked fun at each other whilst learning together. However, I wish that the duration could have been longer, maybe three hours in total, so that we could learn more techniques and practise more!"

**01** **What advice would you give to other Junior Boys who are aiming for this award?**

However, as time passed, we learnt to put our differences aside and began cooperating for the sake of the team. I'm sure that the few of us will continue to keep in touch long after graduation.

**01** **When and why did you join BB?**

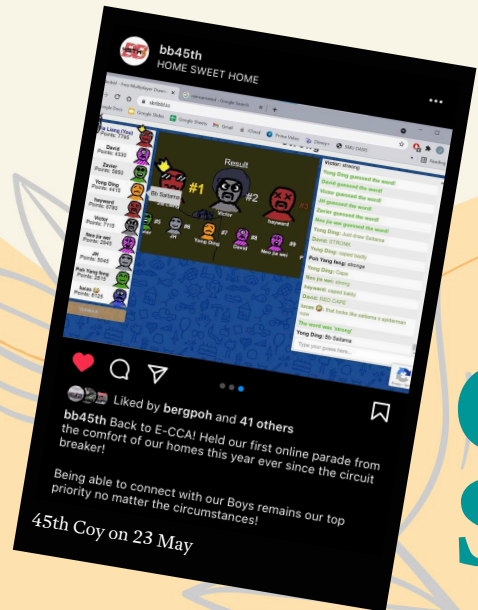
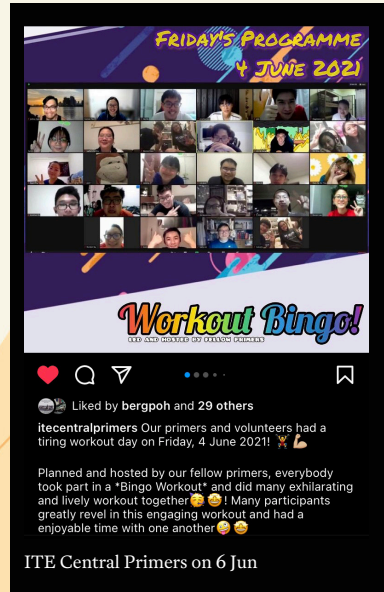
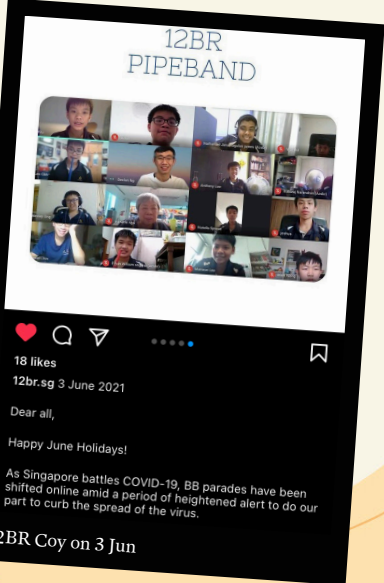
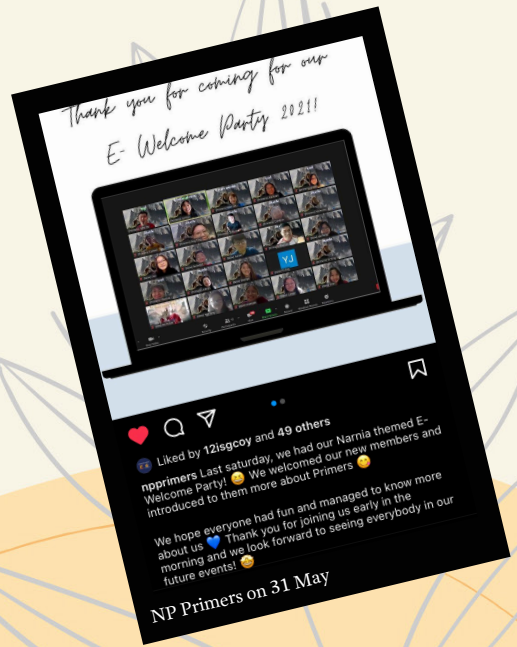
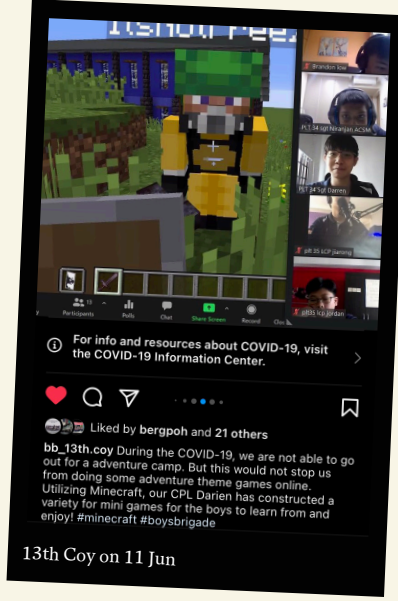
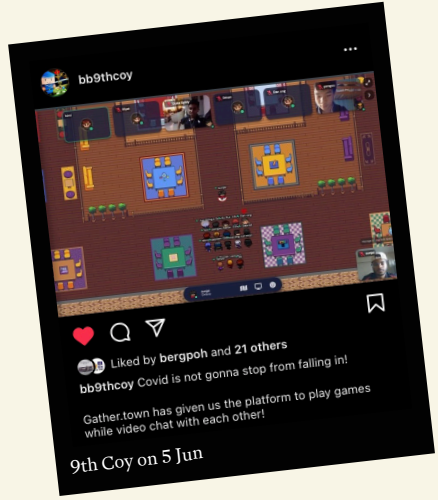
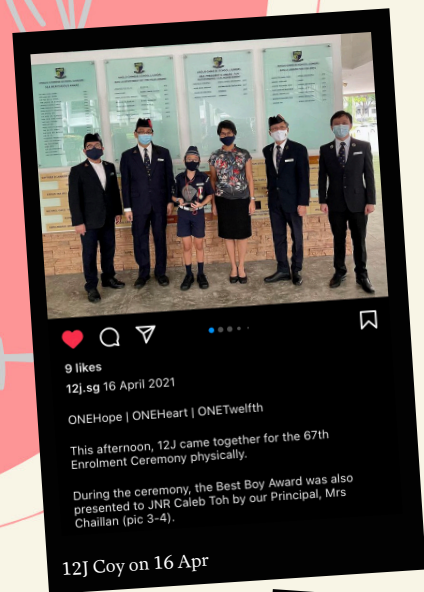
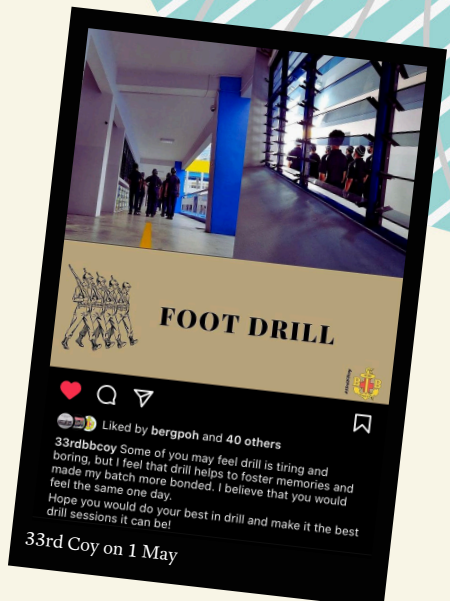
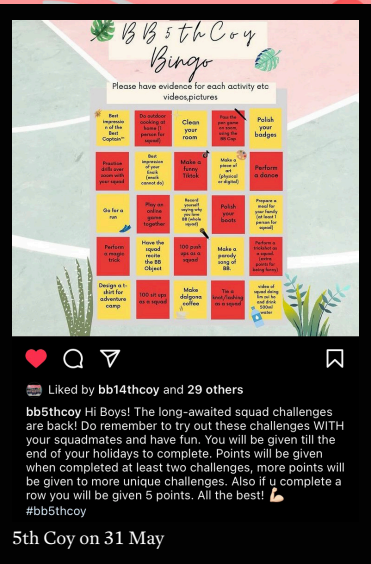
**02** **What has been the most memorable experience of your BB journey?**

This Anchor Conference: Reimagining Community, some 63 BB Officers from 34 Companies gathered online for a day of renewing their skills and knowledge to better lead and serve the Boys and Primers in their respective Companies.

Keeping in mind the Conference theme of Reimagining Community, Pastor Edric Sng, Deputy Senior Pastor from Bethesda (Bedok-Tampines) Church and Editor of Thir.st and Salt & Light, shared in his keynote address on what it means to pivot to digital communication in this day and age, how the BB can learn from the working world and how Officers can lead the Boys and Primers forward.

After the keynote address, the Officers participated in their selected workshops as follows:

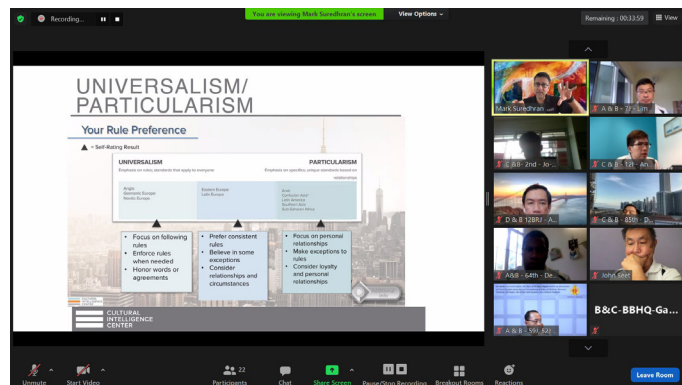


## 1 Asset Based Community Development by Ms Grace Ann Chua, Associate for Community Partnerships at the National Volunteer & Philanthropy Centre (NVPC)

Ms Chua introduced a model and a practical approach for community development work that recognises, emphasises and leverages both intangible and tangible assets. Through the workshop, Officers learnt to identify connectors within their Companies and how to structure conversations to uncover such assets.

“This was an eye-opener for me to see the different kinds of resources that were possibly available in the community. Everyone has something to give and to contribute. Most importantly, it is the willingness of each person in the community to share their gifts and talents. Likewise, in Furen Primers, it is important for the Primers to be aware of their strengths and to develop in them a heart that is willing to contribute to society. Through service-learning projects and student-led initiatives, this would provide the platform for Officers to impart values and important learning points to the Primers.”

Mr Suredhran introduced the importance of not just developing one's emotional quotient (EQ) but also 'Cultural Quotient'.



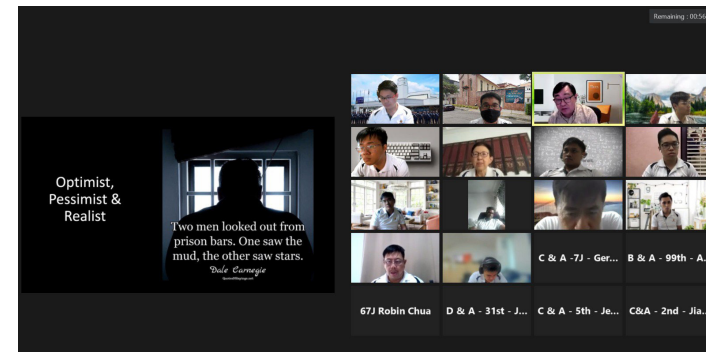

## 3 Reimagining Boys' Brigade in the New Normal by Dr John Ng, Chief Passionary Officer and Founder of Nexleaders.com

Mr Ng taught the Officers on how to change mindsets, stay sharp, be future-focused and how to innovate constantly to fit the 'New Normal'.

“When Anchor Conference shifted to being a fully online conference, I was not sure if I could fully focus for the entire duration. But having great speakers, inspiring content and continual note-taking helped. This workshop focused on being systematic and intentional to ensure that the things we do in The Boys' Brigade remain relevant and true to our Object. Being an engineer by training (though not my current profession), the session strengthened my working principles and challenged me to apply the shared tools for review, leading to further improvement. In fact, the Framework for Review affirmed the process that our Company had used to review our term plan was on the right track.”

“Change is constant especially in this current situation with interruption as the norm. One point that stood out for me from Dr Ng's sharing is on “systematic and continual improvement”. This is especially so for our BB CARES programme to the elderly home which we have been visiting for many years. Our programme before COVID-19 will no longer be possible given the current situation. I learnt that we would need to implement a hybrid approach in future to incorporate more online platforms.”

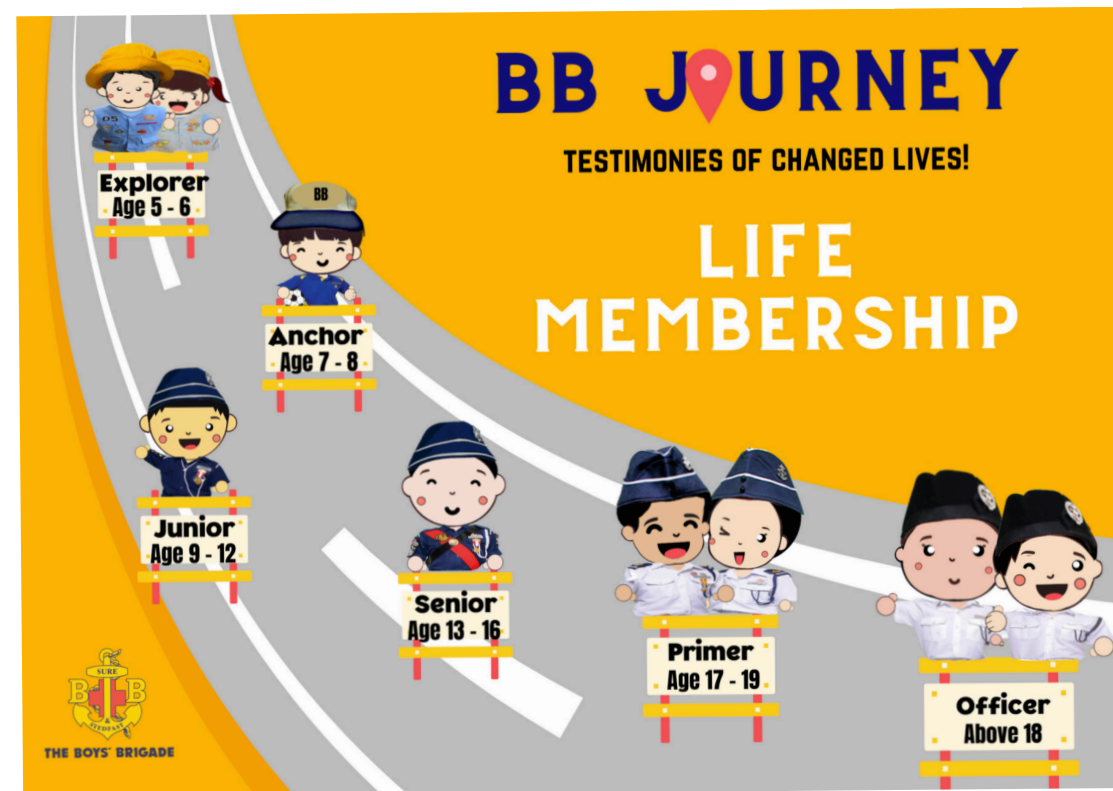


The Ministry of Education has allocated to us two three-storey blocks of former school buildings at 10 Kwong Avenue. They were formerly used as primary schools (Kwong Avenue School and Sennett Estate School). Its last use as a student hostel was quite some years back. The condition has since deteriorated and the buildings are not in a functioning state now.

The surroundings for the new BBHQ comprise mature residential estates such as Sennett and Potong Pasir, as well as new estates such as Woodleigh and Bidadari with some new 10,000 family households.



## Vision of Nurturing Young Lives

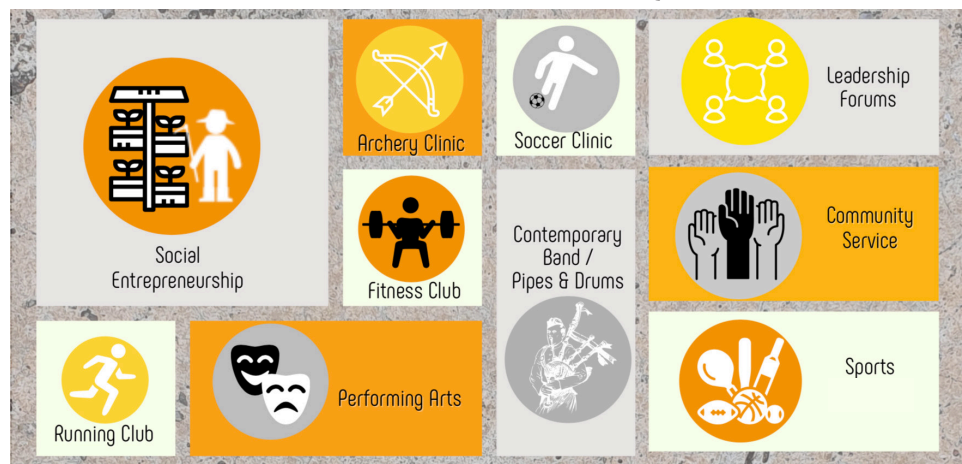

## Vision of Intergenerational Community Life



We intend to extend the BB's influence to residents in the neighbourhood and bring more people to know the BB and our heart for the community. These fun and purposeful programmes are not only meant to benefit our Boys' and Youths' growth and development, but also serve to promote intergenerational and familial bonding.

## The New BB Headquarters Relocation Fundraising Goal

We hope to raise a total of \$1.1 million from BB Officers, Boys, Stakeholders and Supporters to realise the potential at the new BB Headquarters through generous donations!

The costings include:

- \$660,000** for basic construction works for facilities including
  - Tearing down existing structures and re-partitioning into usable space
  - Ceiling, floor and sanitary works
  - Interior and exterior painting works
  - Electrical sub-station & re-wiring electrical works
  - Air-conditioning condenser units
- \$300,000** for basic fixtures, fittings & equipment for rooms, halls and dormitories
- \$140,000** for new programmes including
  - Relocation event - a community engagement project for surrounding residents
  - Other community events such as BB CARES & BB Share-a-Gift
  - Stakeholder engagement events for parents, volunteers and old Boys
  - Interest group events

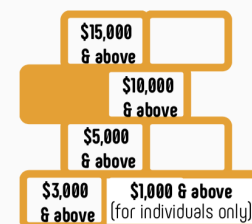
