I read an article today, whose opening statement read: "Cats are eating more than 2,000 species of wildlife globally, including hundreds that are of conservation concern" (ST: 15/12/23). In exercise of its natural instinct to hunt, cats have become "among the most problematic invasive species in the world." Are you a "cat," or the "more than 2,000 species of wildlife globally ... of conservation concern?"

The instinct to survive is within all of us. An instinct which leans us towards being takers more than givers – with takers striving "to get as much as possible from others," while "givers are the rare breed of people who contribute to others without expecting anything in return" (**Give And Take** by Adam Grant). The instinct to take is often subtlety honed by human society which encourages us to achieve and accumulate, often in competition with others.

Our Heavenly Father on the other hand teaches and encourages generosity toward others, to which the Apostle Paul testifies in Acts 20: 33-35, I have coveted no one's silver or gold or clothes. You yourselves know that these hands ministered to my own needs and to the men who were with me. In everything I showed you that by working hard in this manner you must help the weak and remember the words of the Lord Jesus, that He Himself said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.

The Apostle Paul knew he could not cling on to the earthly things, and hence chose to lay up treasures for himself in heaven, blessing rather than seeking to take from others. There was no sense of FOMO (fear of missing out) within him, as he looked to his future inheritance in the kingdom of God – an inheritance he deemed to be of far greater worth that all he might ever be able to accumulate on earth.

Will you share in this heartbeat, and under the love of our Heavenly Father, be of "the rare breed of people who contribute to others without expecting anything in return?" Giving back to the community in whatever ways within our means, rejoicing when we see others helped and lifted up, under the conviction that it is indeed more blessed to give than to receive!

BB Share-A-Gift 2023

Every year, the Boys play their part in the Boys' Brigade Share-A-Gift (BBSG) project, seeking to bring joy and cheer to the community during the year-end festive period. The signature community service project mobilises more than 3,500 Boys and volunteers every year to pack and deliver food necessities hampers to beneficiaries across Singapore during the Christmas season since 1988. The project returns for its 36th year, expanding its support to families with children living in rental housing under the Ministry of Social and Family Development's (MSF) Community Link (ComLink) programme for the first time since its inception. The project benefited more than 45,000 beneficiaries this year.

The opening ceremony was graced by Ms Indranee Thurai Rajah, Minister in the Prime Minister's Office and Second Minister for Finance, and Second Minister for National Development. The BB will continue to nurture our Boys to develop a caring heart for the community and we hope more will join us to celebrate the spirit of charity and fellowship this year!
