We also invited twenty elderly folks from Care Corner Active Aging Centre to join us for this year's BB CARES 2022 Anchor Event. The participants used the materials that they had brought to the upcycling workshops and created useful environmentally friendly products, such as name tags and tote bags. They also engaged in beach clean up activities, where they picked up litter along the beach, to revive the beauty of nature.

Growing Inward, Going Outward

Trees will grow well when they are given the right conditions, such as sufficient sunlight, water, carbon dioxide and minerals. They will grow big and strong roots which will absorb and transport water, nutrients and minerals from the soil to the rest of the tree, the branches, the leaves, any budding flowers on the tree, and any fruit growing on the tree. Trees that grow well will provide many useful things, including food, shade and oxygen, reduce ambient temperatures, improve both air and water quality, create economic opportunities, beautify the area, and so on.

Similarly, the Boys' Brigade (BB) provides our Boys and youth (members) the right environment to grow well through the following methods:

- 1. The concept of the Company to foster Camaraderie in members.
- 2. The use of the uniform to forge a common identity and esprit de corps.
- 3. The awards system to sustain interest in members and to nurture them to their fullest potential.
- 4. The promotion system to recognise and encourage leadership.
- 5. The development of the habits of obedience, reverence, discipline, self-respect, and teamwork through the structure of the uniform, badges and drill.



The BB provides an exciting array of activities for our members, and they are developed in the following aspects:

1. Personal Mastery

Members are developed in their character and personal habits of effectiveness and excellence that will allow them to succeed in life, which includes developing physical, mental, social, and spiritual disciplines.

2. Leadership

Members discover the basic building blocks of relational influence in the foundational leadership habits of encouragement, social initiative, trustworthiness and service to others. They also apply the core leadership principles and lead by example in the company and the Brigade.

3. Community Spiritedness

Members explore the various societal needs present in the community and respond with a heart of service by workingtogethertoplanandexecutecommunityservice projects. Through this, members develop empathy. Closer to their community, members are able to focus on family values which create a strong foundation for building and deepening familial relationships.

4. Global Awareness

Members are connected with the rich history and legacy of the BB as a local and global movement, encouraged to develop an appreciation for the challenges facing the world today, and to contribute as active concerned global citizens.

The BB enables our members to develop and strengthen their moral character, trains them to become loyal and responsible citizens, promotes an appreciation of physical fitness, and develops the members' leadership potential. In the BB, we also nurture our members, based on Christian values, to serve and lead, through intentional mentoring by dedicated Officers.

Members are given opportunities to serve and lead both within the Company and in the Brigade. They also have the opportunity to serve and lead the community through community service projects such as BB Share-a-Gift and BB CARES, as well as in other community service initiatives including contributing to national initiatives like the national digital literacy programme, caring for the environment, strengthening family bonding, and caring for the poor and needy.

The BB provides the right platform for our members to Grow Inward and then to Go Outward to make a positive difference in the community and society. Through structured and wholesome programmes, members Grow Inward as they are given the space to explore, discover, and develop themselves with a view to allowing them to excel in their strength. They develop and hone their leadership and skill-sets, develop godly character and values, and a sense of social responsibility. Opportunities are also provided for members to Go Outward, to use their leadership, talents, and strength to serve and better the community, help others in the society, and be a blessing to those around them. We equip our members to lead a fulfilling life by Growing Inwardly thereby developing positive traits which will ultimately be reflected in their lives externally as they Go Outward.

I would hope that we reflect a little deeper on our organisation and participation in programmes which reach out to the aged and handicapped, and exposure to the importance of these individuals, plus the care of our environment. May these programmes open the door toward:

- the development within us of a heightened sensitivity and compassion toward those faced with greater challenges than us in our daily lives,
- a deeper understanding and appreciation of the worth of these individuals as they are, and
- a greater willingness to sacrifice our own time and sensibilities to help others.

As a Brigade, our desire is for all Boys and Officers to grow into true Christian manliness, in reflection of our Lord Jesus Christ. This encompasses:

- our growing in empathy and love of the challenges and differences we will find in people,
- that we not suffer from selfishness or empty conceit, and
- our regarding others as more important than ourselves, and their interests as more important as our own (Philippians 2:3-4).

Stepping out to care for our environment, the aged and handicapped, let us:

Have this attitude in yourselves which was also in Christ Jesus, who, although He existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant, and being made in the likeness of men. Being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. (Philippians 2:5-8)

Have this attitude in yourselves ... be a bond-servant ... obedient to the point of death.

Bringing Life with Music

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
(12BR Singapore Company)




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Let's Plog! Keep Fit while Saving the Environment

In support of the nation's Digital For Life movement, 39th Singapore Company was honoured to help out at the launch of the new Heartland Gems @ South West Augmented Reality Trail on 2 July. Our 37 BB Boys were the Ambassadors for the event. The trail was officially launched by Ms Low Yen Ling, Minister of State, Ministry of Culture, Community and Youth & Ministry of Trade and Industry & Mayor, South West District.

Before the launch, a group of Boys helped to pack the goodie bags for participants, which they later distributed on the event day. Other Boys were deployed as ushers stationed at checkpoints along the trail to direct participants to the correct paths. In addition, they also shared relevant event information to curious passersby. When the event started, our digital savvy Boys were on hand to guide the invited senior residents on how to use the AR features and QR codes using their smartphones.

As the Boys did not have much opportunity to venture beyond their school campus for community events in the past two years due to the pandemic, this event provided the platform for them to step out of their comfort zone. Whilst some of them experienced difficulty in communicating in dialects with the elderly, they also managed to find ways to overcome the challenge.

Through this event, the Boys also realized that the digital technology that they enjoy in their everyday lives could be complicated and confusing for some people in the society who are less technologically advanced. They also found this experience to be interesting and meaningful as they saw how something that they had previously deemed small and simple, such as taking photos with the AR animals, could bring joy onto the faces of the elderly. More importantly, the Boys felt that they have learnt to be more patient and empathetic to others around them.
