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REFLECTION AND RESPONSE

-CLIMB THE LADDER

POH LEONG BERG (LTA), BRIGADE PRESIDENT

In the course of our normal, pre-pandemic lives, we were always busy trying to stay on top of everything we do. However, COVID-19 has interrupted and changed our lifestyle, the way we engaged our Boys, and the way The Boys' Brigade (BB) activities were carried out.



While it has been tough, the pandemic has given us the opportunity to benefit from the gift of rest and reflection. It has been a time to reflect on how precious and precarious our lives are and assess the effectiveness of the BB programmes in nurturing and mentoring our Boys into leaders of character with godly values.

Reflection and Response are two sides of the same coin. Reflection allows us to make sense of things, to challenge our thoughts, gain perspective, discover breakthroughs, and discern purpose in our lives and in the BB. Response thereafter propels us forward, increasing our fruitfulness. Reflection and Response need to co-exist for the best outcome. As we start the New Year, climbing up from where we were through reflection and reaching towards our desired outcome as we respond, the LADDER approach is a useful tool.

LISTEN

We need to be diligent and alert to the situation around us by listening with our ears, eyes, and heart; listening to what is spoken and unspoken, and to what people are doing and not doing.

Listening with an open mind and empathy allows us to understand and to hear diverse views so that the real issues can be revealed to be resolved. We can only learn by listening so that we can improve.

REFLECTION

ASK

Asking relevant questions will get us the answers we need. We need to poke and prod during conversation to draw useful conclusions so that we can make good plans.

Asking ourselves the following questions allows us to reflect to be better and make meaning for ourselves and in our BB involvement.

- 1 What is my life's purpose? What do I want for myself during my time in the BB or serving in the BB?
- 2 What insights and core values do I want to impart to those whom I have the opportunity to influence?
- 3 What lessons can I take from the experiences during the pandemic? What do I want the new normal to be for myself and the BB?

REFLECTION

DISCERN

Discernment allows us to understand and discover things, finding the root of the matter. It relies on intuition and rational thoughts to find the best option.

We need wisdom to discern what people are telling us and to determine what the truth is. We need to take a step back, see the big picture, and assess what was spoken with honesty and clarity.

REFLECTION

DETERMINATION AND PASSION

Our determination and passion will enable us to do the impossible. These characteristics will bring us into the new future and ride through the unknown. It allows us to feel our way, taking one step at a time, moving in the direction of our vision and building the bridge as we cross.

We need to be committed and be deeply involved in realising our desired future if we hope to be successful. When we are committed, our determination will bring us the wisdom, energy, and resources needed for the work. Passion will give us the courage to fulfil the vision.

RESPONSE

END IN MIND (VISION)

Vision inspires. Having the end in mind (a focused and clear vision) will spark and fuel the fire within, and draw us and others forward. We need to boldly go where no one has gone before, to set new standards, to step into the new frontier.

It is important for us to see the big picture and not lose sight of the vision. This perspective will allow us to be relevant, open to new methods, and boldly innovate to reach the Object of the BB.

RESPONSE

RALLY THE PEOPLE

To achieve the vision, we need a good team. We need to rally the people through leadership by example, inspire confidence, give hope that the vision will be accomplished, and provide direction.

As we work with people who are supportive and aligned to the vision, we need to create an environment that is conducive for growth, capitalise on people's strength, and empower them for the BB ministry. We need to invest in and develop these people as they will accomplish many things for the BB because of their passion.

RESPONSE

Reflection and Response need to be part of our life journey process. We learn from our past, move to the present, and then speak of hope for the future. It is a discipline that we must all adhere to regularly so that we can live a purposeful life and create meaningful programmes in the BB ministry.

Choosing to Grow

How will you live the year 2022? Many people give little thought to the future—it just kind of “happens” to us.

As you choose to grow and explore new possibilities in the new year, pay attention to how God will cause these activities that you choose to try out lead to growth in your character.



A New Cultural Experience

Collaborating with three other Uniformed Groups from the school (NPCC, Girls’ Brigade and Red Cross Youth), we organised a Wayang Kulit Exposure session using a grant from the National Arts Council!



A total of 45 Boys and 102 Girls attended the hour-long session online on 27 October to understand the background of Wayang Kulit and the use of puppets. Two thrilling stories were weaved into the presentation and our Boys and Girls shared that they had thoroughly enjoyed this new experience!

A HEART FOR OTHERS

Secondary 3 Boys from the 10th Singapore Company (Beatty Secondary School) took the lead role this year to plan and organise the 2021 BB CARES project. They thought carefully about the beneficiaries for the project and chose to bless the migrant workers here. They empathised with their difficult situation during the pandemic, having been away from their homes for a long time. They wanted to show some care by packing gift bags filled with necessities such as disposable face masks, wet wipes, body wash and food items such as biscuits and noodles for them.



A total of 21 Boys and five Primers from 10th Singapore Company, together with five Boys from 76J Singapore Company (First Toa Payoh Primary School), and six Officers participated in this project. On 18 December 2021, the team put smiles on the faces of the 47 migrant workers as they shared the gift bags at a construction site at Lorong 8 Toa Payoh!



“Initially, I felt that we wouldn’t be able to complete the project on time due to the shortage of manpower. We were given a budget for the gift bags and we tried to obtain the best prices for the items. To do this, we had to compare prices across supermarkets and online stores. One thing I learnt in this group project is to schedule regular meetings and to split the tasks after reviewing each person’s current workload. This project is great as we do not know much about the migrant workers initially. But now, we get to meet them, see their living conditions first hand and learn how the COVID-19 situation has impacted them.” - SSG Lee Wei Hao (pictured above, second from right in second row)

“When we discussed this project, the top priority that surfaced was the hardships of migrant workers. We were concerned if they had enough for their daily needs and if there were medical supplies to protect themselves from the virus during severe lockdown periods. Hence, we made sure that the items we distributed would be useful and help to remind them that they are not alone in this pandemic. Here's some of the words of advice and thoughts from a few of the recipients!



"Knowing I inspired a junior to reach for leadership roles or create a community service outreach programme showed me that even though serving can be tiring, lives are being changed in the process and that's the whole point of me being in BB."

The culture we created as a cohort was a very encouraging one. For example, Head Primers would be handwriting letters and creating care packs for other Primers and juniors to encourage them for their exams.

I was very glad to receive The President's Award. However, I do not think that the award is about me. Rather, it is a testament to the encouragement and support of my Officers, Teachers, seniors and cohort through these years. Without them, this Award wouldn't mean as much."


I would like to encourage potential applicants to focus less on the award, but more on helping others in the Company as well as the local community."

Given the current pandemic situation, our Company decided to think of ways to engage beneficiaries in the community in a fun, yet meaningful activity. We approached Woodlands Social Centre (WSC) as it was affiliated with our sponsoring church. After much discussion within the Company, we decided on a virtual terrarium workshop as it seemed like a unique activity!

The terrarium kits were delivered to our 27 Boys and 52 WSC beneficiaries' homes a day prior to the online Zoom workshop on 30 October. We conducted icebreaker games for introduction and shared with the participants about terrariums as well as its care and maintenance. For the practical component, we proceeded into breakout rooms. Our Secondary 3 Boys provided instructions whilst the rest assisted and interacted with the beneficiaries.



I think that the workshop offered families some bonding time, as parents helped their children with building the terrariums. It is indeed a good phygital experience for all!




"I appreciated the leadership opportunity to share my knowledge and to help the participants create their own terrariums. I also learnt to remain patient and be encouraging when teaching others."



SPREADING JOY AND KINDNESS



The annual Boys' Brigade Share-a-Gift (BSAG) Project entered its 34th year at its official launch on 20 November! Deputy Prime Minister Mr Heng Swee Keat was the Guest-of-Honour, together with Presenting Sponsor Prudential Singapore's CEO Mr Dennis Tan, FairPrice Group's Retail Business CEO Ms Elaine Heng, Brigade President Mr Poh Leong Berg and BSAG 2021 Chairman Mr Henry Tan at the event.

With the pandemic still ongoing, face masks were also included to meet the changing needs of beneficiaries. Mr Henry Tan shared, "As we transitioned to endemic living, many families and individuals continue to be affected by the social and economic impact brought upon by COVID-19. BBSG remains committed to helping the less privileged in society."

BBSG continues to spread joy and kindness to 44,167 beneficiaries, with 8,503 receiving Specific Wishes and 35,664 receiving General Wishes. General Wishes beneficiaries receive either BBSG Food Hampers, NTUC FairPrice vouchers worth \$40 or food hampers ordered via FairPrice Online. Specific Wishes beneficiaries receive items based on individual requests such as shoes, clothing and appliances.

Online Fundraising for Our Future



Earlier in 2021, we started to raise funds for the development of the new BB Headquarters and activities hub at 10 Kwong Avenue. Rectification work has commenced from late 2021 and construction work will be carried through 2022. Many BB stakeholders, including Officers, Chaplains, Teachers, Boys, Primers, Alumni and sponsoring churches had supported our cause generously.



Celebrating its 90th Anniversary in 2021, the 2nd Singapore Company (Victoria School) invited their old Boys to jointly raise a target sum of \$25,000. The Company had far exceeded this initial fundraising goal in early June 2021, but continued with the enthusiasm of the Old Boys and their family members.



The 12BR Singapore Company (Anglo-Chinese School (Barker Road)) fundraised in memory of their founding Officer-in-Charge, the late Mr Loo Kee Hian. The BB had always been an integral part of Mr Loo's life and he had contributed much to the starting of 12BR Singapore Company from 1994.



The 12I Singapore Company (Anglo-Chinese School (Independent)) hopes to raise \$20,000 in honour of their former Captain and Teacher-in-charge Mr Jonathan Ng, who will be retiring in 2022, after nurturing generations of men and women.

Other BB Companies that joined in the fundraising efforts online on the Giving.sg platform are the 17th, 21J, 26th, 28J, 28th, 37th, 64th and 86th Companies. We are truly heartened by these self-initiated Company fundraising campaigns. 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
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
